## CHILDREN'S VOTING COLLOQUIUM

Chair Keenan, Chair Ryan, and members of the Joint Committee on Election Laws, I'm Julie McClure, a voter in Concord, MA, parent, and former educator **in support of S.412 / H.670 An Act enabling children's right to vote**.

Many of the policies most harmful to young people stem from the absence of their representation. With recent federal budget cuts that remove nutrition assistance for children in poverty, the lack of fair representation for children is a matter of survival. It is urgent for children to be represented and to have a voice in this imperfect system, if for no other reason, so they might access nutrition assistance and housing stability.
